

Rick Anderson Workshop Supply List

Bring your normal painting materials, acrylic and watercolor paint (you can use acrylic as watercolor).

- Any brand of Bristol Smooth Paper Pad, 20pk 9"x12"
- Three 15"x20" sheets of thick illustration board. Available online or at your favorite art store
- A variety of good quality art paper for collage - various colors with patterns and designs that you find interesting...can be handmade paper
- Paintings on paper that you consider throwaways that can be torn or cut for collage
- 4-5 Acrylic Paint Brushes: Pre-set packages of various thicknesses, or hand select a variety of thickness from skinny/fine to 2" thick. Purchase sizes and brands of your choice. Walmart has cheap 1"-2" brushes in the house paint section.
- Container for water to rinse brushes
- Variety of pencils and color pencils (I use Prismacolor Pencils)
- Scrap pieces of canvas if you plan to work on canvases
- Photographs you have taken, i.e. -Barns, landscapes, florals, old houses etc. you can use for reference
- Disposable Palette or palette of your choice. I like to use disposable white Styrofoam plates
- Roll Masking Tape
- Scissors
- Small bottle of *Aleene's* Original Tacky Glue
- Ruler
- Paper towels
- Set of 4 Micron watercolor proof pens.

NOTE: If you are an oil painter, it is not necessary to purchase acrylic paint
