Supply List

Your Projects

You will need to bring items for 3 projects—an apron, a T-shirt, and a tote bag—all available at Michael's, JoAnn's, and Hobby Lobby. Dharma Trading Company is a good online source of fabric paints, very paintable fabric T-shirts, aprons, and other apparel.

Fabric Paints

Bring fabric paint (available online or at Michael's, JoAnn Fabrics, or Hobby Lobby); I suggest 2 oz containers of at least 6 colors, plus black and white. Favored brands are Jacquard Textile Paint (including Lumiere and Neopaque); Arteza; and Marabu. BUT Tulip is easily found locally. It is suggested that you use either Tulip Soft or Tulip Matte, although not absolutely necessary for class. Tulip also makes Fabric Markers which you will want to use. Tulip spray paints are very useful and handy and excellent for working with stencils. You may also want to try some fabric spray paints, not required, but a lot of fun. **See note below.

Brushes

You will need to bring a variety of brushes: At least 2 flat (sizes 1/2 inch - 2 inches) and 2 round (sizes 0-4); the stiffer, the better.

Additional Supplies

- Art journal or sketch pad for design plans.
- Cardboard boxes (broken down) to prevent paint from leaking from front of Tee shirt to back.
- Table cover
- Water container
- Sampling of pens and pencils
- Stencils
- Scissors

**The instructor will provide a piece of muslin to practice painting on. You will see the difference in "hand" (the feel of the fabric) using acrylic paint, acrylic paint mixed with textile medium, and fabric paint. You will also get to try using fabric markers and fabric spray paint with markers on your sample piece).
